Dog Licensing

Dog licenses expire December 31 and must be renewed by the following January 31. All dogs over five months of age must be licensed.

A valid rabies certificate and the fee of \$10 for an unaltered dog or \$5 for a spayed or neutered dog is REQUIRED. You can license at Village Hall in person, through the drop box, or by mail. The certificate will be returned to you, with a copy left on file.

Please do not combine your dog license fee with any other type of payment. Thank you!

At its meeting of November 17, the Village Board appointed fellow member Kathy Stolzmann as Village President through the remainder of the term, which ends April 2017. The other Trustees cited her experience, leadership, knowledge of Village government, and involvement with the community in support of their decision.

Centreville Settlement Records Another Successful Year

Over 500 interested persons attended an open house at the Lutze Housebarn on June 27, 2015. Nathan Chisholm, Archivist and Membership Chairperson organized the daylong event which included tours, weaving and spinning demonstrations, displays of the restoration progress. Sarah, Matt and Amber Lutze were on the front line for tours through the housebarn. Chris Kuehnel anchored the stump puller station while Richard Lutze engaged children with simple toys of the era. President Richard Wiegand welcomed visitors and Kathy Sixel and other volunteers managed the registration. Nathan's family served hearty German style food on a picture perfect day. Niles and Barb Klaves shared the historic garden story and Kathy Pearce assisted with parking and old time music.

The 29th anniversary of the group continued with timber frame repair, stone masonry, a historic garden, artifact identification and classification. The garden produced a bounty of heirloom tomato, rhubarb, beans, rutabagas and potatoes for farm style lunches during workdays. An experienced intern, Nathan Chisholm of Plymouth has begun working on the collection of artifacts-computerizing the collection. One of the fascinating aspects of the restoration includes a stump puller from the 1800 which Chris Kuehnel and Charlie Simmons are re-engineering to the original construction.

Tours of the nationally significant project are available on work days by calling in advance to Sarah Lutze at 693-3454.

Work days are scheduled to begin for 2016 on March 26. All are welcome. Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, a delicious, hot home delivered meal. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the County. In Cleveland and its surrounding areas meals can be delivered up to 3 days a week. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.

Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income.


