There were two historic learning events sponsored by Centreville Settlement Inc. (CSI) In May, the Sourdough Bread Making Workshop taught by Kathy Pearce was followed by Bread Baking Lessons led by Chris Kuehnel at the Klessig Bake Oven. August 19th featured Old Times Trades with Restoration Master Alan Pape teaching cedar shake shingle making, and CSI members sharing how to hew a timber, peel a log and make a mortice for timber frame construction. Nathan Chisholm coordinated a Pioneer Encampment and showcased immigrant skills and a fun filled day with tug of war.

Hands on stone masonry classes began on July 1st. The northwest corner area is 20 foot long, 6 foot high wall is current being built with field stones from area farms. All are welcome to come to learn, strengthen yourself and enjoy fellowship with this satisfying art form.

A historic building report is planned for the next expansion phase of Centreville Settlement...reflecting the 35 year history and the next decade plans.

### Helping Improve and Protect Manitowoc County's Lands and Lakes

Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) continues to be an active stakeholder in helping improve and protect the lakes and lands of Manitowoc County.

As part of an on-going, collaborative effort to control invasive plant species in Manitowoc County, LNRP has received a grant from the Wisconsin DNR to map and treat the highly invasive common reed grass or "invasive *Phragmites*" in the county's near-shore townships. Invasive *Phragmites* is a perennial wetland grass introduced from Europe that grows rapidly and forms dense stands that crowd out native vegetation, which in turn reduces plant species diversity and wildlife habitat quality. Invasive *Phragmites* is also a safety and fire hazard and will clog drainage ways rapidly.

With this WDNR grant, we hope to control populations of invasive *Phragmites* for up to three years. The private properties selected to participate in this project will have their invasive *Phragmites* thoroughly treated during the first year (2017) from August to October, with follow-up treatments as needed in subsequent years, depending on funding available.



Native beach grasses, which stabilize the shore, anchor the sand, and are good for Hika Bay, will be planted when the high lake levels become less challenging. We will revisit the work later this year and monitor our results.



### **Public Works**

**SUMMER SEWER RATES:** From the May 25 - September 27 water meter readings (July 1 - October 1 water/sewer bills), the Sewer Utility will charge only for the average amount of water consumed December 1 through the May meter reading. This adjustment reflects the increased use of water for summer activities, such as gardening and pools, where the water does not enter the treatment system. The Water Utility will charge for all water used.

YARD WASTE SITE HOURS: CLOSED MONDAYS - Tuesday through Sunday, 7:30am – 8pm. Availability is weather dependent, and the site may close on occasion for maintenance. Call Public Works, 920-693-8236, and leave a message with your contact information if you have an extensive yard project outside of regular hours. With sufficient notice, we can coordinate access for you or your contractor.

**GRASS CLIPPINGS:** Do not mow grass into the street. Grass clippings and yard waste plug storm sewers, leading to water backups and flooding. Please rake material out of the grate to drain the water if plugged. If that doesn't work, call Village Hall at 920-693-8181.

**BUILDING PERMITS:** Building permits are generally required for building improvements, adding permanent or temporary structures or fencing, and completing repairs. Due to the volume of requests, it is recommended you allow a minimum of TEN business days from the time a building permit application is dropped off until approval. Applicants for projects involving new buildings or expansions, or changes in use, should meet with Village staff early in the planning process. Contact Village Hall at 920-693-8181 to make an appointment. The application form is available on the Village website, www.clevelandwi.gov, and can be left in the Village Hall drop box. Remember, fees double if work is started without a permit.
