Interpretive Kiosks to be Installed at Hika Park

The Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership and the Village of Cleveland, with the Friends of Hika Bay, will install two interpretive kiosks in Hika Park in the next few weeks.

One will be installed along the Centerville Creek corridor and the other near the Hika Shores property north of the boat landing. Both will use photos and graphics to tell each site's history and explain the restoration efforts that began almost a decade ago.

The creek kiosk is called "A Village Shaped by Water" and will tell the story of the dam and millpond that was built in the 1890's. The wooden dam collapsed in 1906 and a concrete dam was built. Then in 1924 the dam collapsed again and, for the next ten years, the community struggled with how to pay for a new dam. In 1934 residents arranged a Gala Fall Festival to raise funds for a new dam. The festival featured a picnic, dance and parade. Forty cents bought a ticket to the dance and twenty-five cents got a luncheon plate at the picnic. After two successful money-making picnics, a new dam was erected in 1935, impounding 12 acres of the creek and enlarging the mill pond. Local citizens enjoyed the benefits of their Old Mill Pond for seven years. In 1942 a heavy rainfall caused the Mill to collapse and wash away into Lake Michigan. The dam was removed completely in 1996.



The second kiosk tells the story of the ridge swale community and the importance of habitats along the Lake Michigan shoreline. With the restoration of Centerville Creek, the sediment removed from the abandoned mill pond was repurposed just down the road at the Hika Shores property. Crews restored the ridge/swale habitat, rebuilt a section of dunes, and created a new naturalized ridge along the roadway.

We invite you to visit Hika Park to enjoy the park and the beautiful view of Lake Michigan, take a stroll across the pedestrian bridge, and give the kiosks a good look!
