Lakeshore Technical College Prepares To Offer Culinary Arts Education At The Cleveland Campus

Construction is underway at the LTC Cleveland campus to create a brand new culinary arts learning environment. LTC culinary arts students currently attend classes at a leased restaurant facility on Sheboygan's riverfront, where the college first launched the program in 2012. The relocation to Cleveland will offer significant benefits to students and the community.

Students will learn and hone their skills in a newly constructed commercial kitchen custom-designed for educational purposes. A baking lab will provide the opportunity for additional learning opportunities. Students will also benefit from more convenient access to vital college services including academic assistance and financial aid, as well as expanded opportunities to become engaged in student activities.

"We're excited about bringing LTC's culinary arts program to our Cleveland campus and offering students a state-of-the-art culinary learning environment," says LTC Dean of Business, Technology, and Hospitality Doug Hamm. "We're also looking forward to better serving the whole student by providing easier access to all college support services."

Job prospects for LTC culinary arts graduates are bright with demand in the region for professionally-trained chefs continuing to grow. The recent accreditation of the program by the American Culinary Federation (ACF) provides graduates with an additional employment edge as ACF certified culinarians.

The college also plans to offer culinary-related Community Education courses in the new space. These courses are open to Cleveland residents, as well as the general public, for personal enrichment and will be scheduled during the evening or weekend hours beginning Fall 2020.

LNRP to co-host a series of Coastal Resiliency Workshops

Extreme rainfall events as the result of climate change have increased over the last half-century in our region, and scientists expect these trends to continue. Combined with land cover changes including increased urbanization, heavy precipitation will continue to lead to flooding, erosion, declining water quality, and negative impacts on transportation, agriculture, human health, and infrastructure.



As a response, the Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) will be co-hosting a series of coastal resiliency workshops in May and

June that will follow the Lake Michigan Stakeholder (LMS) Spring Member Meeting scheduled for May 14th in Milwaukee.

Participants of the spring meeting will learn the ins and outs of innovative green infrastructure (GI) practices from planning to maintenance. You'll hear about the challenges and possibilities of managing water where it falls and explore how GI has been incorporated in Milwaukee's Walker's Point neighborhood. The meeting will take place at the Coakley Brothers Water Tower Building where the site can hold up to 212,000 gallons of water thanks to Green Infrastructure!

Organized by Linda Reid of Water365, the additional coastal resiliency workshops will focus on (1) the challenges of precipitation changes on communities; (2) steps to resilience planning; and (3) practical tools for resilience implementation such as green infrastructure, innovative technologies and financing, and municipal code and water stewardship audits. Speakers will include a panel of representatives from the Wisconsin Coastal Management Program, and local engineering firms and environmental consultants, including, Ruekert & Mielke, Stantec Consulting, Bay Lake Regional Planning Commission, and EHSE Management Solutions.

Targeted participants include municipal officials and elected representatives, municipal staff representing departments of public works, water resource management agencies, interested shoreland owners, and environmental groups.

All workshops will run from 3:00 to 5:00 pm, with time afterward for networking. The two local events are scheduled for: Monday, June 1: Sheboygan, Mead Public Library

Monday, June 8: Manitowoc / Two Rivers, Wisconsin Maritime Museum

A follow up webinar, on sharing access to resiliency tools, will be hosted in July 2020. Check the LNRP calendar for more details as they develop!


