LNRP Leads Phase Two of the Centerville Creek Restoration Project

The first phase of the Centerville Creek Restoration Project, aimed at enhancing native fish and bird habitat and populations and improving Lake Michigan water quality, has been completed. Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP), a leading land and water conservation organization in Wisconsin, established and coordinated several key partnerships to drive project success. This conservation collaboration included the Village of Cleveland, UW-Madison, UW-Manitowoc, and the Friends of Hika Bay.



During this first phase of the project, the creek was restored to a meandering stream constructed with pools, riffles, and other fish habitat structures. The riparian zone was planted with trees, shrubs, forbs, and grasses designed to recreate a "cedar swamp" with time. Hika Park absorbed the newly restored Centerville Creek Corridor and the Hika Shores properties to become 13.9 acres from the original 2.2 acres.

Our team is now going to complete the partial restoration that was started in 2010, using lessons from the storm surges in 2012 and near record-high lake levels to establish stronger bank treatments and sustainable revegetation.

This phase of the Centerville Creek Restoration Project will re-establish native riparian vegetation and natural stream features to improve aquatic and terrestrial habitat. Wood structures will be installed to (1) control hydraulic conditions to promote survival and longevity of newly planted vegetation; and (2) provide cover and refuge for fishes, reduce local sediment inputs, and increase stable bed material necessary for spawning. The outcome will be more robust and diverse native fish and bird populations in the ecosystem and improved Lake Michigan water quality.

Lakeshore Technical College's Horticulture Program Moving to the Main Campus

Lakeshore Technical College students enrolled in horticulture program courses have been learning at the college's Environmental Campus, located on the south side of North Avenue across from the college's main campus, since 2011. After a thorough evaluation of the property and program in 2020, the college determined it would be beneficial for students and the college to move all program activities to the main campus. As a result, the horticulture program will begin hosting students at the college's main campus by fall 2021 and the Environmental Campus was put up for sale in early 2021.

"Our horticulture program is still going strong, we are just moving across the street," said LTC Program Coordinator and Horticulture Instructor Sam Oschwald Tilton. "We are excited about the new lab space and greenhouse that will be built this summer."

The move will lead to students spending more time on the main campus where the majority of student activity takes place, such as advising, tutoring, and club meetings. It will also elevate the program's visibility among students and staff.

Lakeshore's Horticulture Technician technical diploma program can be started in August or February and completed in two terms. Emphasis is placed on sustainable practices and hands-on learning. Courses cover a variety of topics including fall culinary plants, landscape design studio, greenhouse and nursery production, and landscape installation. Shorter-term certificate programs offered include Landscape Horticulture Basics and Plants – Production & Care.

All courses can be taken by program students and anyone interested in learning about horticulture. Students can also join the college's Horticulture Club and help coordinate the club's annual plant sale, set for May 15 this year, 7 am to 3 pm, at 2220 N. Sixth St., Sheboygan.
