Centerville Creek Restoration Project



The Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP), Fish Creek Restoration, Holschbach Excavating, and Stantec Consulting Services have completed the second phase of the Centerville Creek Restoration Project.

The Centerville Creek Restoration Project began as part of a dam removal and stream restoration project within the former millpond that existed in the Village of Cleveland for over 100 years. In Phase One, the creek channel was restored to a meandering stream constructed with pools, riffles, and other fish habitat structures. During Phase Two, stream banks were reinforced using soil lifts and wood structures. The





riparian zone was planted with trees, shrubs, forbs, and grasses designed to recreate a reforested and healthy river system.

Grant funding came from the Fund for Lake Michigan, the US Forest Service, and the Wildlife Conservation Society Climate Adaptation Fund.

Centreville Settlement will be celebrated the accomplishments for 2021 at the annual old time Holiday Dinner which will be held Sunday December 5 at The Meats Opera House in St. Nazianz. The German meal and fellowship begins at 3:00 pm, meal at 4:30 followed by a brief program.

The 40th anniversary of the group continued with timber frame repair, stone masonry and historic garden. The heritage garden produced a bounty of heirloom tomato, rhubarb, beans, rutabagas and potatoes for farm style lunches during workdays.

Tours of the nationally significant project are available on workdays and by special arrangement in advance.

In October PBS was on site to film the Lutze Housebarn and the dedicated volunteers for a documentary.



Lakeshore Technical College Recognized Among the Best Colleges in 2021
