Village of Cleveland Secures Funding for Emerald Ash Borer Mitigation



The Village of Cleveland received funding assistance from ROOTS – Restoration of our Trees Sheboygan. ROOTS is a collaborative effort between Sheboygan Rotary Club and Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership to address the serious threat of the Emerald Ash Borer area's rich forestry resources.



The \$10,000 in funding support is designed to improve public safety through elimination of high-risk ash trees either susceptible to or infected by emerald ash borer (EAB), planting high-quality trees with low maintenance needs, and establishing a routine and comprehensive program for ongoing urban tree care.

The Village hired Arborist Tim Bull of Tim's Tree Treatments in 2020 to inventory all ash trees and other dead or dangerous trees in the maintained areas of the Village's three parks and the street trees on Lincoln Ave. Working from the Village's 2001 tree inventory, he identified in tabular form each tree that could be treated and each tree that should be removed; prioritized tree removals; and noted whether removal would be easy (could be done without special equipment or experience) or difficult (requiring professional assistance). This effort will be expanded to cover the entire Village.

The highly aggressive emerald ash borer (EAB) is an exotic beetle now found in 35 states across the US. Since 2002 when it was discovered, it has killed hundreds of millions of ash trees across North America. LNRP Secures DNR Surface Water Education Grant for Friends of Hika Bay Water Quality Monitoring in Southern Manitowoc County

This project will allow Friends of Hika Bay (FOHB) to demonstrate how restoration and management actions in local watersheds impact Lake Michigan by continuing to collect and share valuable water quality data. The sharing of the data allows community members to take ownership in the protection and improvement of the frontal watersheds.

Sampling sites in the past have included Centerville, Fischer, Point, Pine, and Calvin Creeks. Analysis includes e-coli, phosphorus, nitrogen, and six additional water quality parameters. The interns will present their summer findings at a UWGB-Manitowoc Campus event in October. Everyone is invited! Please watch for details on the Friends of Hika Bay website: friendsofhikabay.org.

Lakeshore Technical College



College Here & Now Program Through Lakeshore Technical College Benefits High School Students, Families, and the Community

Since its launch in fall 2019 at Sheboygan North and South high schools, the College Here & Now program offered through Lakeshore Technical College has expanded into five additional district area high schools including Manitowoc Lincoln and McKinley, Kiel, Mishicot, and Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah.

Students at these schools can take college level courses without leaving their schools and without any tuition cost. They can also earn a technical diploma in information technology (IT) from LTC at the same time they graduate from high school.

College Here & Now was developed to address the growing need among local businesses, large and small, for information technology expertise. The program makes a college education more accessible for all students. Students can enter the IT workforce upon graduation and/or continue their education at LTC to earn an associate degree. Some employers will provide tuition assistance for the additional education.

Lakeland University is also a College Here & Now partner. The transfer agreement between Lakeland and LTC allows LTC's IT associate degree graduates to transfer into Lakeland's computer science bachelor's degree program with junior status.

College Here & Now is a nationally recognized program. The Bellwether College Consortium has twice selected it among the top 10 cutting edge, trendsetting workforce development programs worthy of replication by community colleges. A team from LTC presented the program at the consortium's Futures Assembly in San Antonio, Texas February 27-28, where 30 colleges from across the country competed for the top awards in three categories. LTC competed in the workforce development category.
