With the beginning of the school year upon us, please be aware of additional traffic in school zones and additional busses on the roads. Laws protect students who are getting off and on a school bus by making it illegal for drivers to pass a school bus while dropping off or picking up passengers, regardless of the direction of approach.

Make school bus transportation safer for everyone by following these practices:

- When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
 - When driving in neighborhoods with school zones, watch out for young people who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking of getting there safely.
 - Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks in neighborhood.
 - Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.
 - Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street without looking for traffic.
 - Learn and obey the school bus laws in your state, as well as the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:
- **Yellow flashing lights indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children.**
Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.
 - **Red flashing lights and extended stop arms** indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

LNRP and the Friends of Hika Bay Wrap Up Summer Water Quality Monitoring with UWGB Interns

Six UWGB interns supported by UWGB Manitowoc Campus professors sampled and analyzed surface water in four Southeastern Creeks during the 2022 summer. A total of 25 locations in Centerville, Pine and Calvin Creeks plus the Little Manitowoc River were visited every Monday (and again after a half-inch or more rain). Analysis included e-coli, phosphorus, nitrogen, and six additional water quality parameters.

The interns battled neck-deep creek waters after rains, those scratchy nettles and mosquitoes we all hate, slipping and falling into creek bottom muck, scary red slimy stuff, experiencing firsthand the impact of herbicide spraying and road construction, temperamental instruments, the joy of seeing test results proven to be accurate and more. Of course, there were also those glorious summer days when we all want to experience the great outdoors!

Disc Golf. Lakeshore's 18-hole disc golf course is free and open to the public. The first hole (basket) is located on the east side of West Campus Drive. The college is in the process of making improvements to the course to make it even more user-friendly for the growing number of people playing the course.

Trails/Campus. The college's 154-acre campus features forested and meadow areas, a winding creek, trails, and paved paths that are open to the public.

Fitness Center. Cleveland residents 18 years or older may use the college's Fitness Center at no charge. The facility is equipped with treadmills, elliptical machines, a stair machine, exercise bikes, free weights, weight machines, and more. It is open Monday-Thursday 6 am-10 pm, Friday 6 am-4 pm, and Saturday-Sunday 6-11 am.

Centreville Settlement Continues Historically Significant Work

The workdays are continuing at the Lutze Housebarn on the second and fourth Saturdays of the months of Sept Oct and winding up on November 12 usually going from 10 am-3 pm.

Heritage Trees and the historic garden continues to flourish—just as it did in the 1800s with Fredrickia and Gottlieb Lutze farmed on the property on South Union Road.

A tour of 20 persons from the Pomerian Historical Society came for a tour of the Housebarn to see the architecture, learn the stories of immigration by the Lutzes and experience the history told by the artifacts and curated rooms in the 104 foot long structure.

Centreville Settlement will be celebrating the accomplishments for 2022 at the annual old time Holiday Dinner which will be held first Sunday in December 5 For further information—check the Centreville Settlement Facebook.

Village of Cleveland Receives Grant from ROOTS



The Village of Cleveland received \$10,000 in funding assistance facilitated by the Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) to mitigate the impacts of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). LNRP's overall effort includes the innovative partnership with the Sheboygan Rotary Club and the collaboratively created ROOTS program or Restoration of our Trees Sheboygan.

The multi-faceted approach of the ROOTS initiative provides support to communities in the Sheboygan area whether they need assistance with planning or implementation, while also engaging residents through outreach and education. The unique public-private collaborative model of ROOTS leverages multiple funding sources, boosting local resources and stretching the value of each dollar provided by generous local donors, while also bringing in state and federal dollars for a greater collective impact and investment in our communities. Each of these complementary projects contributes to the shared goals of helping our communities recover from the devastating impact of the EAB and restoring the valuable tree canopy.

The grant to the Village of Cleveland is to improve public safety through elimination of high-risk ash trees infected by emerald ash borer (EAB), planting high-quality trees with low maintenance needs, and establishing a routine and comprehensive program for ongoing urban tree care.

The Village hired Arborist Tim Bull of Tim's Tree Treatments in 2020 to inventory all ash trees and other dead or dangerous trees in the maintained areas of the Village's three parks and the street trees on Lincoln Avenue. A DNR Urban Forestry grant updated the Village inventory this summer. The ROOTS investment will allow Tim to revisit the inventory and create a long-term action plan for the Village. Tree planting will occur in fall of 2022 at Dairyland Park where several ash trees were eliminated last year.
