A reminder from the Cleveland Police Department. Winter parking is in effect for the Village of Cleveland, December 1st until April 1st from 1:00 am to 6:00 am.

Please have your vehicles off the streets during these hours or possibly later for snow removal. Please be courteous to those trying to clean up winter's mess.

We want everyone to be safe during the winter months. Now is a good time to check the tread and the air pressure on your tires.

BE PREPARED!

You must be ready for whatever you may encounter Yes, this is common sense, but how many of us jump in our vehicle when the weather looks nice and end up in a storm? Carrying a few items in your vehicle can prepare you in the event of an emergency.

- Proper clothing (loose layers of clothing, extra gloves, rain gear)
- A flashlight in the glove box
- A blanket, food, and water
- Cell phone and charger (Don't talk or text while driving)
- A bag of sand or salt and extra windshield washer fluid
- A windshield scraper
- Jumper cables
- Always have at least a half tank of gas during the winter
- Plan long trips carefully and what weather conditions may you encounter?

Lakeshore Technical College Saw Successful Grant Funding In 2022

Lakeshore Technical College experienced significant success in competitive grant funding in 2022. According to Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen, the average annual competitive grant award more than doubled, resulting in a record amount of funding – \$8 million – over the last year.

Grant awards increased due to improvements made to Lakeshore's pre-award grant strategy. The strategy, which is saving the college time and resulting in significantly higher amounts of awarded funding, was recently selected as a top 10 Bellwether Award finalist. Bellwether Awards are given annually and widely regarded as one of the nation's most prestigious recognitions for community colleges.

Grant funding supports students preparing for in-demand, high-paying careers that employers in the Lakeshore district are looking for. Award highlights include:

Workforce Innovation

This \$1.64 million grant was awarded through Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers' Workforce Innovation Grant Program, which was funded through the American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA). The grant addresses the critical labor shortages made worse by the pandemic, threatening our region's manufacturing-heavy economic stability. The initiative is funding training and education efforts focusing on training underserved populations and upskilling current workers in automation, robotics, and Industry 4.0.

Wisconsin Technical College System

Lakeshore received approval for \$1.43 million in competitive grant funding from the Wisconsin Technical College System board. This was the highest amount awarded among all 16 colleges in the Wisconsin Technical College System. The funding was awarded to support key areas including a new cybersecurity program, culinary and nursing career pathways, and the radiography, welding, and mechanical design programs. In addition, a total of \$416,095 in allocation grants was received for funding efforts focusing on student success, nontraditional occupations, and professional growth.

Renewable Energy

A \$336,650 grant supports education focused on producing and storing renewable energy. It enables collaboration between Lakeshore and renewable energy business leaders to identify current and future educational needs for rapid changes in the renewable energy sector. Funding will support a lab redesign, the purchase and installation of a solar rooftop mount and ground solar equipment, and curriculum changes. and initiatives that broaden participation for people historically underrepresented in energy careers.



Fitness Center at Lakeshore Technical College Will Close Over the Holiday



The Fitness Center at Lakeshore Technical College will be closed December 23 through January 2 as part of the college's energy conservation initiative.

Regular Fitness Center hours are: Monday through Thursday 6 am - 10 pm; Friday 6 am - 4 pm; Saturday and Sunday 6:30 am -11 am. Open times may change based on classes running.

All Cleveland village residents 18 years or older may use the college's Fitness Center at no charge. The unsupervised facility features treadmills, elliptical machines, a stair machine, exercise bikes, jump ropes, exercise balls, mats, free weights, numerous weight machines, and other fitness equipment.

2022 Lakeshore Water Summit a Great Success

On October 12th, at the University of Wisconsin Green Bay - Manitowoc Campus, members of our lakeshore communities attended the 10th annual Lakeshore Water Summit. Open to the public, these summits highlight the important work done by undergraduate students at UWGB-Manitowoc Campus on our region's freshwater resources.



Led by their professors, Dr. Rick Hein and Dr. Rebecca Abler, students conducted hands-on research and field work to add to our growing database of water quality information for Manitowoc County Rivers and streams. Check out the Friends of Hika Bay website: https://friendsofhikabay.org/

In 2022 the four watersheds studied were Centerville Creek, Pine Creek, Calvin Creek and the Little Manitowoc River. A total of 25 locations were visited every Monday (and again after a half-inch or more rain) from June through August. Analysis included testing for e-coli, phosphorus and nitrogen levels, and six additional water quality parameters. The event wrapped up with a panel discussion and Q&A about the broader environmental and conservation efforts occurring regionally, with panelists representing NOAA's new Wisconsin

Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary, The National Estuarine Research Reserve System, The UW Freshwater Collaborative and The Manitowoc County Dairy Educator.

Teaching Tomorrow's Scientists

Beyond the acquisition of important data – data that is helping to inform management decisions by local units of government and private landowners, including farmers – this work provides an opportunity to both teach and inspire our next generation of scientists.

These highly-motivated students not only shared their experiences in the field and in the lab, along with the technical results of their studies, they also shared their enthusiasm for pursuing science as a career.

These freshwater resources will only become more important as other parts of our country deal with the increasing scarcity of this critical natural resource. Through the work of the University and its nonprofit partners like LNRP and The Friends of Hika Bay, we can have confidence that our freshwater resources will be here for future generations of people and wildlife. We encourage you to get involved.
