Greetings Clevelanders!

The board continues to work on a host of items, big and small, I'll hit on a few from the past months.

- Park signs are on order to remind owners to clean up after their pets so residents can continue to enjoy without our public works staff dedicating valuable time.
- The village wide ATV/UTV ordinance has been adopted and signs placed throughout the village. We held an informational meeting at Lakeshore College with WATVA to review laws within the village and state regarding the operation of ATV/UTV on public roads.
- The public works committee received a preliminary boat launch replacement design and is beginning to discuss estimated costs. The intent is to understand the overall replacement cost of our current launch and pier so the village can apply for the appropriate grant later this year.
- The board has approved a proposal from a 3rd party engineering firm to assist in a long-term solution to the water quality issues. While this is a top priority for us it will take time, tentatively targeting an operational system date of mid to late 2027.
- On the development side, the Clear Sky Rehabilitation center nears competition, a few housing projects are in the early stages, and we continue to discuss other development interests.

I encourage everyone to visit our website www.clevelandwi.gov for more specific information and updates. You'll find contact information for all board members on the site, if you have questions, comments, or concerns contact any of us directly or attend any regular meeting.

Lastly as we move into the much-anticipated summer, traffic will increase, pedestrians will be on the move, and kids will be at play. I ask everyone to be mindful of their speed, keep pets leashed, and watch out for each other.






